The Dutch Ministry of Health encourages the initiative of the European Commission on the open consultation on "Strengthened cooperation against vaccine preventable diseases" and its ambition towards Council Recommendations on vaccine preventable diseases.

Due to globalization and their cross-border nature vaccine preventable diseases can be a major health threat.
