Honourable Chairperson,

I have the pleasure of inviting you to the **6th Inter-parliamentary meeting on the control of activities of Eurojust**, which will take place on **20 November 2025 from 9.30-13.00 in the European Parliament (in Brussels)**.

In accordance with Article 85(1) TFEU and Article 67(3) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1727 on the European Union Agency for Criminal Justice Cooperation (Eurojust), the President of Eurojust shall appear once a year for the joint evaluation of the activities of Eurojust by the European Parliament and national parliaments within the framework of an Interparliamentary Committee Meeting, to discuss the agency's current activities and to present its annual report or other key documents.

The programme of this ICM will be divided into three separate panels. The first panel will be dedicated to the overview of Eurojust activities, on the basis of the annual report, but will also include a debate on recent salient developments the agency has faced in 2025. Economic crime remains a key focus of the Agency's work and represents an important share of its caseload. Alongside evolving fraud trends, in particular online fraud, Eurojust plays an important role in asset recovery within the EU, supporting national judicial authorities in tracing, freezing and confiscating the proceeds of crime across borders. These activities will be addressed in detail in the second panel. Finally, the third panel will focus on the ongoing review of the Eurojust regulation, with a revision expected in 2026.

Against this background, the LIBE Committee, would like to invite Members of national parliaments to the 6th Interparliamentary Committee Meeting on "**The evaluation of Eurojust activities**". The meeting is scheduled for Thursday **20 November 2025 from 9.30 to 13.00** on the European Parliament premises in Brussels (in-person meeting) in **meeting room ANTALL 4Q2**. This meeting will be **followed by a working lunch** offered by the European Parliament to the participants of this ICM.

I am therefore pleased to invite up to four Members of the relevant committee(s) from each national parliament (two from each Chamber in the case of bi-cameral parliaments) to attend this meeting.

Should you be unable to attend, I would welcome any written contribution, which would be distributed to our respective Members and other participants.

Practical details regarding the meeting will be forwarded in due course to your Parliament's services for relations with the European Parliament.

I sincerely hope that you will be able to accept this invitation and I am looking forward to welcoming you to the European Parliament on 20 November 2025.
